Mario I. BLEJER

Mario I. Blejer is currently the Director of the Centre for Central Banking Studies at the Bank of England. He is also a member of the Financial Stability Board and Advisor to the Governor. During 2001/02 he was Deputy Governor and then Governor of the Central Bank of Argentina.

Previously, he served 21 years at the International Monetary Fund, where he was Senior Advisor at the Monetary and Exchange Affairs and the Asian Department, working also in the European, Fiscal and Research Departments.

During his academic career Blejer held the Walther Rathenau Chair in Economics at The Hebrew University of Jerusalem (1996-1999) and he taught at Boston University, New York University, Johns Hopkins, the University of Geneva, and George Washington University. He also held recurrent professorial positions at Universidad de San Andrés, Buenos Aires, Argentina, and the Central European University, Budapest.

Mario I. Blejer received his BA and MA from the Hebrew University of Jerusalem and his Ph.D from the Univeristy of Chicago. He has published a significant number of books and numerous articles in specialized journals. Publications include:
