



Born in İzmir in 1969, Mehmet Yörükoğlu completed his junior high school education at İzmir Bornova Anadolu High School in 1984, and his senior high school education at İzmir Science High School in 1987. Mr. Yörükoğlu was awarded a scholarship at the Industrial Engineering Department of Bilkent University, from which he graduated as a High Honors student in 1991. Having been granted a doctoral fellowship, he received a Ph.D. degree in Economics at the University of Rochester in 1996. Later that year, Mr. Yörükoğlu started to work as an Assistant Professor in the Department of Economics at the University of Chicago. In the 1998-1999 academic year Mr. Yörükoğlu lectured on macroeconomics and finance in the Finance Department of Wharton School, University of Pennsylvania as a visiting fellow. Between 1996 and 2003, he taught in the Department of Economics of the University of Chicago and gave undergraduate and postgraduate lectures on various topics like macroeconomics, monetary theory and policies, economic growth and development theories, dynamic general macroeconomic equilibrium theory and models. Back in Turkey, Mr. Yörükoğlu joined Sabancı University in 2003, where he lectured undergraduate and postgraduate students on macroeconomics and monetary theory in the Department of Economics until he was appointed Deputy Governor of the Central Bank of Turkey on 3 June 2006. Mr. Yörükoğlu's papers have been published in the periodicals such as Journal of Monetary Economics, American Economic Review, Review of Economic Studies, and Review of Economic Dynamics. He was awarded the Successful Young Scientist Award of the Turkish Academy of Sciences (TÜBA) in 2004.
